GRAD 520 - Responsible Conduct of Research
2 credits. Online and Corvallis campus. Covers 10 topics in responsible conduct of research. Useful to all students who conduct scholarly activity.

GRAD 521 - Research Data Management
2 credits. Corvallis campus. Designed to prepare students in data planning, documentation, preservation and sharing in an increasingly complex digital research environment.

GRAD 522 - Preparing an IRB Submission
1 credit. Corvallis campus. Workshop-style course resulting in applications that are ready for IRB review. Meets for only two days in the term.

GRAD 512 - Current Issues in Higher Education
3 credits. Online. Explores current, work-relevant issues in higher education nationally.

GRAD 560 - Theories of Teaching and Learning
3 credits. Online. Examination and analysis of theories and research related to teaching and learning in higher education contexts with emphasis on theoretical applications for GTAs, instructors, and other who teach in the college and university classroom.

GRAD/WR 599 - Writing Workshop for Thesis and Dissertation Writers
3 credits. Corvallis campus.

TUESDAYS, 12-1 PM, MINDFUL GRAD MEDITATION SERIES

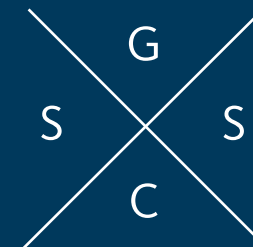
