


GRAD APPRECIATION WEEK

Cascades Campus Art Walk



1. Art Element B
Masayuki Nagase

This sculpture was one of the first exterior commissioned public art installations on campus. Relief patterns carved into the three vertical basalt columns near the residence hall represent the energy of wind.

2. Undercurrent 7
Samantha Wall

Located in the east stairwell of Obsidian Hall, this life-size ink portrait is part of Wall's "See Me See You" series which explores the relationship between external shape and internal forces.

3. Sophrosyne
Weltzin Bill Blix

Blix's celebrated outdoor sculptures can be found in several public locations in Salem and Eugene. This bronze work located in the lobby was created in 1988 and was donated to the university by John E. and Leah Frohnmeyer.

4. Art Element C
Masayuki Nagase

Part of the exterior sculpture series by Nagase, these stone benches and polished boulders were the result of ideas shared during discussions held with students and faculty early in the design process.

5. This Good Land
James Lavadour

Lavadour's work is rooted in the landscapes of eastern Oregon where he grew up on the Umatilla Reservation. This four color lithograph is located in the stairwell of Tykeson Hall.

6. For Colonizers
Ka'ila Farrell-Smith

This is one of five works on the second floor of Tykeson Hall by the Klamath Modoc artist. Utilizing Indigenous art practices and painting, Ka'ila explores the space in between Indigenous and western paradigms

7. Rhizome
Sandy Brooke

Displayed in Tykeson Hall, this oil painting was created in 1993 by OSU-Cascades professor Sandy Brooke. Her teaching philosophy is "banal ideas cannot be rescued by beautiful execution. Critical thinking is key in art."

8. Art Element A
Masayuki Nagase

These columns carved from basalt located west of Tykeson Hall explore the energy of water. This art series is intended to create spaces that encourage community and unify campus design with the natural environment.
