Dr. William Massey at Oregon State University seeks a full-time postdoctoral scholar with a background in psychosocial kinesiology/school health/child and youth developmental or a related field. The postdoc will work as part of a team on a series of community engaged applied research projects that aim to improve the quality of elementary school recess. Primary responsibilities include collaborating with the PI and other study team members on project conceptualization, project management, data collection, data analysis, writing reports for school partners, conceptualizing scientific papers and presentations, grant writing, and preparing manuscripts for submission to academic journals.

This position offers an excellent opportunity to connect research and practice and to further analytical and writing skills on scientific papers. It also will provide the opportunity to gain applied research experience in an applied setting.

The postdoc will also be expected to pursue their own interests and lines of research, and will have access to networking with a rich, multidisciplinary community of scholars and practitioners, with opportunities to attend workshops and colloquia.

Qualifications include:

- a Ph.D. in Psychosocial Kinesiology/ HDFS, Public Health, or a related field
- content expertise, experience and/or research interests related to school health and/or social and emotional development of children
- experience with or knowledge of community engaged research methodologies
- strong qualitative and quantitative analytical skills
- excellent writing and communication skills
- ability to work independently and collaboratively on a team on multiple projects
- great organization skills and attention to detail
